The 2nd edition of Bharat Tex 2025 - Handicrafts took place from 12th to 15th February 2025 at the India Expo Centre & Mart, Greater Noida. This prestigious event brought together industry leaders, international buyers, artisans and policymakers to honour India's centuries-old traditions while showcasing modern advancements.

Bharat Tex 2025 - Handicrafts was a significant part of the prestigious global textiles event organised by the Bharat Tex Trade Federation (BTTF) and supported by the Ministry of Textiles, Government of India. This mega event was held across two prominent venues - India Expo Centre & Mart, Greater Noida (12th-15th February 2025),

which focused on handicrafts, garment machinery and dyes & chemicals, and at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi (14th-17th February 2025), which showcased the entire textile value chain.

Organised by a consortium of 12 Textile Export Promotion Councils, including EPCH, and supported by the Ministry of Textiles, Bharat Tex was a tapestry of tradition and technology. The event featured over 5,000 exhibitors, providing a comprehensive showcase of India's textile ecosystem. More than 1,20,000 trade visitors, from 120+ countries including global CEOs, policymakers and industry leaders, attended the event.

The 2nd edition of Bharat Tex 2025 was held at India Expo Centre, Greater Noida, from 12th to 15th February 2025, and at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, from 14th to 17th February 2025. The fair at India Expo Centre & Mart was declared open by Shri Giriraj Singh, Hon'ble Minister for Textiles, Government of India.

The lamp lighting and ribbon-cutting ceremony was graced by Mr. Pabitra Margherita, Union Minister of State for External Affairs and Textiles; Dr. Mahesh Sharma, Hon'ble Member of Parliament from Gautam Buddha Nagar; Smt. EPCH's Participation at Bharat Tex-Handicrafts 2025

EPCH brought together 600 participants in this show, including 60 exporters at Bharat Mandapam, Pragati Maidan. These EPCH members are leading manufacturer-exporters who have established market linkages across the world. Their products reach store shelves in over 100 nations through wholesalers, importers and retailers. Besides, there were 160 GI Handicrafts producers, 36 traditional toy makers, 100 artisans, 44 young designers in a start-up showcase and five institutions contributing to industry growth and development.

During the fair, there were interactive sessions on ESG in quality parameters, cross-border trade financing, logistics and supply chain management, seamless GST refunds for exporters, as well as a panel discussion on design strategies for business. The 2nd India Sourcing Conclave 2025, organised by Buying and Sourcing Consultants of India, was well attended.

Mr. Dileep Baid, Chairman, EPCH, shared, "This event was a perfect blend of our rich textile heritage and cutting-edge technology. It was not just about showcasing our industry but also about demonstrating our commitment to sustainability, innovation, and expanding global trade. With around 600 exhibitors, including well-established exporters, young designers, startups, and artisans, the event showcased 15 categories, including gifts and decorative items, furniture & accessories, home furnishings, houseware, fashion jewellery & accessories, lamps and lighting, textile machinery, bathroom accessories, garden & outdoor décor, handmade paper products & stationery, leather bags & cases, candles, incense & potpourri, GI products, traditional toys, spa & wellness products, and carpets & rugs."

Dr. Neeraj Khanna, Vice Chairman, EPCH, shared, "At Bharat Tex 2025, visitors had the opportunity to source Geographical Indication (GI) certified handicrafts and textiles. GI products possess qualities, reputation, or characteristics inherent to a specific region, and this event provided an excellent opportunity for GI producers to gain recognition on a global scale." He further highlighted the special attractions, including Traditional Toys, Live Craft Demonstrations, and a Designers' Showcase.
