

Free Dental & General Health Check-up Camp in Saharanpur

The Saharanpur Handicrafts Artisan Welfare Trust, in collaboration with the Export Promotion Council for Handicrafts (EPCH), organised a Free Dental & General Health Check-up Camp at the Common Facility Centre in Saharanpur. Medical services were provided by Max Super Speciality Hospital, Saket, New Delhi, with the aim of offering essential health consultations and screenings to artisans, exporters, and other members of the Saharanpur Wooden Cluster. The camp focused on early detection of health issues and expert medical guidance, with specialists in cardiology, dentistry, orthopedics, and neurology providing their services.



The event was inaugurated by Mr. Manish Bansal, IAS, District Magistrate of Saharanpur, alongside Mr. Mohd. Ausaf, Convener of CFC Saharanpur, in the presence of various association members and key dignitaries from Saharanpur including Mr. Irfan Ul Haq, Mr. Anwar Ahmad, Mr. Parmod Sadana, Mr. Anil Sadana, Mr. Asif Iqbal Ansari, Mr. Ramji Suneja, Mr. Rais Ahmad, Mr. Umesh Sachdeva, Mr. Shahzama, Mr. Javed Iqbal and Mr. Som Goyal. Mr. Manish Bansal, in his speech, commended the initiative and emphasized the importance of health awareness among artisans. He also toured the CFC Saharanpur facility, inspecting the seasoning and chemical treatment plant to assess infrastructure improvements in the wooden handicrafts sector.



A team of medical professionals consisting of cardiologists, dentists, orthopedists and neurologists conducted essential diagnostic tests, including blood sugar level checks, blood pressure monitoring, ECG, and calcium level testing. The camp received an overwhelming response, with over 170 patients benefiting from the medical services. The beneficiaries expressed appreciation for the healthcare support and requested more such initiatives in the future. The event was a significant step towards promoting the well-being of artisans, ensuring their continued productivity and sustainability in the craft industry. ■
