Value addition Programme under (Skill Development Component) at Chenga Traditional Dress Making Cluster, Barpeta (Assam); 6th November 2023

The primary objective of the programme was to impart training for the diversification of product ranges within the cluster. The initiative is part of the SFURTI Project and took place at the Common Facility Centre of Chenga Cluster. The programme was started on 06/11/2023. The Value Addition Programme targeted 25 weavers from different project villages within the Chenga Traditional Dress Making Cluster. The program spanned 30 days and aimed to equip participants with the skills and knowledge necessary to diversify their product offerings. This initiative aligns with the broader goals of the SFURTI Project, focusing on the sustainable development of traditional industries and clusters. The training sessions were conducted at the Common Facility Centre of Chenga Cluster, providing a centralized and conducive learning environment. The curriculum included hands-on sessions, theoretical lessons, and interactive workshops. Experienced trainers and industry experts

facilitated the program, ensuring a comprehensive learning experience. A total of 20 weavers from different villages actively participated in the programme, reflecting the widespread interest and engagement within the Chenga Traditional Dress Making Cluster. Design Development Training Programme at Sovima Village, Dimapur, Nagaland; 18th November 2023



The primary aim of the program was to provide training for diversifying product ranges within the cluster. This initiative is a part of the SFURTI Project and occurred at the Common Facility Centre of Bamboo Handicrafts & Naga Textiles Cluster in Dimapur, Nagaland, specifically on 18th November 2023, at Sovima Village. The Design Development Programme targeted 20 weavers from different project villages within the cluster, spanning a 30-day duration with the objective of creating new designs/products. This endeavor aligns with the broader objectives of the SFURTI Project, emphasizing the sustainable development of traditional industries and clusters. Design Development Training Programme at Chenga Dress Making & Weaving Cluster, Barpeta, Assam; 1st December 2023

The curriculum encompassed practical sessions, theoretical teachings, and interactive workshops, with seasoned trainers and industry experts facilitating the program to guarantee a comprehensive learning experience.

Training Program for Strengthening Members of SPV at Mirza Mini Diversified Cluster, Mirza, Assam under SFURTI; 22nd December 2023
