EPCH organised a workshop on 'Innovative Packaging for Wooden Handicrafts Products' at Jodhpur, Rajasthan, with the presence of Mr. Hansraj Baheti, Member, COA, EPCH & Regional Convenor - North West Region-EPCH; Mr. Radheshyam Ranga, prominent EPCH member; Mr. Nirmal Bhandari, Patron, Jodhpur Handicrafts Exporters Federation; Mr. Naresh Bothra, President Jodhpur Handicrafts Exporters Federation; Mr. Rajesh Gupta, Member, EPCH NWR Mentorship Group; Dr. Madhab Chakraborty, Packaging Advisor-EPCH & Packaging Expert and over 80 exporters from Jodhpur.

In its endeavour to achieve three times exports till 2030, the Council has initiated various hand-holding programs on Design, Packaging and Productivity. The workshop's objective was to impart knowledge to participants on contemporary packaging strategies to improve the sustainability, portability, and consumer appeal of their products. Wooden handicrafts are a diverse and beautiful category of handcrafted items that add warmth, character, and a touch of nature to any home décor. These items are made from a variety of woods, and are often intricately carved, painted, or inlaid with other materials such as metal, shell, or stone. This workshop sought to bridge the gap between craftsmanship and effective packaging.

Mr. Naresh Bothra, President, Jodhpur Handicrafts Exporters Federation (JHEA), said innovative packaging is an important tool for exporters of wooden products. It can help to protect the product, enhance its value, differentiate it in the market, reduce shipping costs, and increase sustainability.

Dr. Madhab Chakraborty, Packaging Expert and Packaging Advisor-EPCH, spoke about the most effective packaging trends for wooden handicraft products and what businesses must implement to make their packaging eco-friendlier. He shared few suggestive packaging prototypes developed based on the exploratory visits undertaken a month ago and feedback received

from Jodhpur based exporters. These prototypes were designed to address the unique needs and requirements of wooden handicraft products. The prototypes included Environmentally Friendly Packaging Materials, Artistic Packaging Designs, and Innovative Product Presentation. The workshop proved beneficial

to stakeholders in many ways, including providing hands-on experience in packaging techniques, discovering novel ideas to cut costs and promote sustainability, and promoting the export of eco-friendly glass products. The session ended with a Q&A. ■

Decorative Handicrafts Products; Jaipur; 12th March 2024
