## EPCH at 2nd Ambiente India 2015 25<sup>th</sup>-27<sup>th</sup> June, 2015; New Delhi

"Ambiente" and "Heimtextil" are among the world's renowned consumer goods fair in Germany, organized annually by Messe Frankfurt, Germany. The combination of both the fairs by the name of "Ambiente India" and "Heimtextil India" is organized in India by their counterpart i.e. Messe Frankfurt Trade Fair (India) Pvt. Ltd. in association with EPCH. The second edition was held from 25-27 June, 2015 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi.

EPCH had a setup of an exclusive handicrafts pavilion along with 17 member exporters from various parts of India

He discussed with exhibitors about their craft/products and appreciated their efforts & handicraft products.

For three days, 162 exhibitors from 7 countries presented their multifaceted decor, lifestyle and furnishing products to the Indian market across 11,000 sqm of exhibition space. Focused on interior décor, home textiles and furnishings, the



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strategically co-located fairs proved to be the perfect way to start off the Indian buying season. Ambiente India presented a wide range of products for the consumer market in India in the segments of Dining, Giving and Living. This show is a major player in the high-volume sector and created a trade hub for manufacturers, designers and suppliers of home décor and interior accessories with enhanced opportunities to showcase current trends, to launch new products and to discover home fashion innovations.

## Gandhi Shilp Bazar celebrates lace crafts

The Gandhi Shilp Bazar, held from 13th to 22nd July, 2015, at the International Lace Trade Centre, Narsapur (Andhra Pradesh), was inaugurated by Mr. Samir Kumar Biswas (IAS), Development Commissioner (Handicrafts), in the presence of Mr. Rakesh Kumar, Executive Director - EPCH; Mr. GVK Rama Rao, President, All India Lace Exporters Association; Mr. K NTulasi Rao from Pan Godavari, Narsapur; participating artisans and member exporters.

While welcoming the distinguished guests, Mr. K N Tulasi Rao from Pan Godavari said that the International Lace Trade Centre (ILTC) is the jewel of Narsapur and organizing events at ILTC as Gandhi Shilp bazaar would not only increase the market for lace products but would also provide a moral boost to the artisans and exporters.

While addressing the gathering, Mr. Rakesh Kumar Mr. GW informed that the ILTC is a one of its kind facility not only in Andhra Pradesh but in the entire South India in such a huge area. He also said EPCH would initiate many more activities in Narsapur area in the coming time such as implementing of skill programs in East and West Godavari districts of Andhra Pradesh. He also mentioned that EPCH is considering setting up of a dyeing unit at Narsapur because people from Narsapur area have to travel a long distance for dyeing. He also requested the exporters, NGOs and artisans to form a working committee to run the ILTC effectively and act as active stakeholders so that the ILTC becomes an international hub.

Mr. Samir Kumar Biswas (IAS), Development Commissioner (Handicrafts), assured the participants that O/o DC(H) would provide all support to this sector to compete in the international market and that facilities at ILTC should be utilized by every artisan. He suggested that Narsapur lace manufacturers should work in the direction to obtain GI Certification that would provide a new and bigger brand image at both national and international levels and that soon there would be training programs in East and West Godavari. Mr. Biswas also mentioned that there is huge demand of lace

facility. Mr. Kumar also announced that working office space would be provided to All India Lace Exporters Association at ILTC on the request of their President.

## Visit to Common Production Center at Seetharampuram, Lace Park, & Local Village

Mr. Samir Kumar Biswas and Mr. Rakesh Kumar visited the Common Production Center at Seetharampuram village. The CPC was built under CHCD Mega Lace Cluster Scheme. They had a look at the display of products produced by lace artisans of the area. Mr. Biswas interacted with the artisans and enquired about production, wages and types of yarns generally used. Besides suggesting to parallely focus on the domestic market, Mr. Biswas requested EPCH to organise 2 day workshops at Kolkata with cluster products so that lace products are introduced to domestic markets. Mr. Rakesh Kumar advised artisans to also make ribbon kind of lace with flowers, for the purpose of packing.

They also visited artisan houses where artisans were making laces and enquired about their well being. He also asked them about artisan ID cards and Insurance.
